Component 1: Prayerful Passion

Component 3: Mission Community

Nehemiah 2:17-18, Chapter 3

How and what did Nehemiah communicate to those gathered around him? (What reminder does he give?)

How did they respond?

How does the rebuilding project affect their community?

How many individuals/groups were involved in the rebuild project? Who made up the teams?

Component 2: Crystal Clarity

Nehemiah 2:2-8

How did Nehemiah respond to the questions of the king?

How did Nehemiah know what to ask for?

How did the king respond to Nehemiah's action? (Why did he respond this way?)

Component 4: Conflict Resolution

Nehemiah 2:19-20, 4:1-3, 7

Did everyone buy-in and join the rebuild? (Why?)

What was the reaction of some?

Why did they react this way?

What can we learn from Nehemiah in handling those causing conflict?
